



Spring Creek Baptist Church Re-entry Covenant

Spring Creek Baptist Church makes every possible effort to protect the health and safety of members and guests. We strive to make reasonable efforts to minimize risk and promote good health and hygiene practices within the congregation during all church activities. We are committed to preventing the spread of disease and have implemented heightened safety protocols to prevent the spread of disease in church facilities. Our established protocol includes agreement and adherence to the *Re-entry Covenant*.

The Hebrew term for covenant is berit which means "to bond." It is translated into Greek as syntheke (binding together) or diatheke (will or testament). In the Bible, a covenant is a relationship based upon mutual commitments. A covenant is typically a promise or obligation to God and others. We earnestly enter this covenant of re-entry together as a body of believers.

Therefore, every person over eighteen acknowledges receipt of the document to indicate their adherence to the terms noted below before attending services and events onsite.



I agree to and will abide by the terms below as a condition of my attending onsite services and events at Spring Creek Baptist Church.

1. I will wear a mask covering my nose and mouth at all times when inside buildings.
2. I will ensure my hands are clean by using hand sanitizer immediately before attending a service or event.
3. I will practice social distancing and be respectful of the social distance of others.
4. If I have symptoms indicative of being ill, I will refrain from attending in person gatherings until I know I am not contagious by order of a doctor or until at least 24 hours after my symptoms disappear.
5. If I have tested positive for COVID-19, or been exposed to someone who tested positive for COVID-19, I will follow the [CDC Guidelines](#) before returning to any in-person gathering.
6. I will not bring a sick child to church.
7. I will ensure that my child or any child in my custody and under my control, is symptom and/or fever-free for at least 24 hours without medication before returning to church unless cleared by an independent licensed medical professional.
